

ONGOING PUBLIC PROCUREMENT REFORMS AND MAPS ASSESSMENT — INVITATION TO VIRTUAL STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT SESSION

The Bureau of Public Procurement (BPP), in line with its statutory mandate under the Public Procurement Act, 2007, is currently implementing a series of comprehensive reform initiatives aimed at enhancing transparency, accountability, and efficiency in Nigeria's public procurement system. These reforms are an integral part of the Bureau's broader strategy to align Nigeria's procurement framework with international best practices and to advance the **Renewed Hope Agenda** of His Excellency, **President Bola Ahmed Tinubu, GCFR**.

As part of these reforms, the Bureau is conducting a **Methodology for Assessing Procurement Systems (MAPS)** exercise across Ministries, Departments, and Agencies (MDAs). The MAPS framework, developed by the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD), is a globally recognized diagnostic tool designed to assess the quality and performance of national procurement systems and identify opportunities for improvement in transparency, value for money, competition, inclusivity, and accountability.

Recognizing the critical role that **Contractors, Consultants, and Service providers** play in the procurement ecosystem, the Bureau will be holding a **virtual stakeholder engagement session** to brief you on ongoing reforms and the MAPS assessment process.
